

ABOUT ROBERT MOSES

Choreographer, Writer and Composer Robert Moses has created numerous works of varying styles and genres for his highly praised dance company, as well as composing many of the sound and narrative scores for those works since 2008. Moses has choreographed for dance, opera, and theater companies including Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater, San Francisco Opera, and Lorraine Hansberry Theater. He has taught at festivals and on college campuses throughout the US and internationally, including OPEN LOOK St. Petersburg International Dance Festival, Serendipity Arts Festival (Kolkata, India), Bates Dance Festival, UC Berkeley, and Stanford University, where he served as Dance Lecturer and Choreographer-in-Residence from 1995 to 2016.

Vincent Chavez

Vincent hails from Albuquerque, NM. He trained at LINES Ballet Training Program, Ballet Hispanico, Academy of Nevada Ballet Theatre, and Dance Theatre Southwest. He has danced with Nevada Ballet Theatre, Oakland Ballet Company, ZiRu Dance, GreeneWorks Project, New Mexico Ballet Company, as well as, National and International touring as an independent Creative. Vincent joined RMK in 2012.

Iva Dixson

Iva Dixson originates from San Francisco, CA. She trained at the Ruth Asawa San Francisco School of The Arts with Elvia Marta and Andrea Hinman, as well as the Rome International Dance Academy, directed by Andrea Palombi and Sara Lourenco. Iva has danced with Vangelis Dance Company. She joined RMK in 2023.

Jenelle Gaerlan

Jenelle is from Portland, Oregon, and trained under BodyVox's Junior Artist Generator (JAG) program. She has danced for DarVejon Jones Dance Ensemble, Soulskin Dance, and BodyVox Dance Company under Emmy Award-winning choreographers Jamey Hampton and Ashley Roland. Jenelle reps Portland's street dance community, rooting her style in house dance, waacking, and breaking. She joined RMK in 2021.

Marlayna Locklear

Marlayna hails from Milwaukee, WI. She began her training at City Ballet Theatre and went on to graduate from Milwaukee High School of the Arts and University of the Arts In Philadelphia, PA. Marlayna was a founding member of The Milwaukee Dance Connection and went on to dance with companies including Dallas Black Dance Theatre II, Deeply Rooted Dance Theatre, and Dayton Contemporary Dance company. She joined RMK in 2022.

Elena Martins

Elena grew up in Massachusetts and went on to graduate from SUNY Buffalo with a BA in dance and a minor in speech and hearing science. She has performed with Prometheus Dance (Boston), Lorraine

Chapman The Company (Boston), Axis Dance Company, RAWdance, *CALI&CO* dance, and Bellwether Dance Project, among others. Elena joined RMK in 2018.

Juliann Witt

Juliann Witt originates from Lafayette, CA. She graduated from SUNY Purchase with a BFA in dance performance and has danced with Garrett Moulton Productions, RAWdance, DTSF, SF Symphony, Concept o4, Bellwether Dance Project, Sarah Bush, and Fullstop. Juliann first performed with RMK in 2015 and rejoined in 2020.
